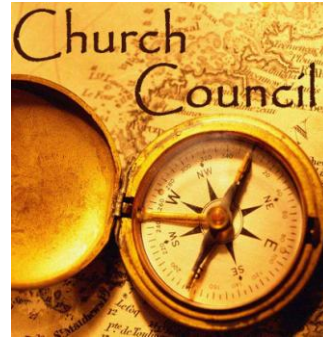


Church Council

is the charge given to the nine members of the church Council. The Council is responsible for consideration of policy, coordination of our total life, and development of future visions for our church's ministry.

Responsibilities & Scope

- Elected by Congregational vote
- Serves as the agent for the Congregation, partners with the Pastors to promote the life of the church, and represents the church in the community
- Coordinates the work of church Commissions & Committees in the planning & the execution of their missions – each Council member is a liaison to a Commission and thus represents that Commission's concerns and plans at Council meetings
- Ensures church expenditures & income align with the budget passed by the congregation
- Membership on the Council is for three years:
 - Three of the nine members begin office each year
 - Three of the nine members retire each year
- Minimum one-year church membership required
- The Council meets monthly & in special session as required.
- Convenes special congregational meetings such as the annual January Budget meeting
- Organizes the Annual June Congregational Meeting to review the past year and to elect new leadership for the coming year
