







Call to Worship & Opening Prayer


One:	We gather together in the name of the One who bids us come.






Reflections Half a Dozen Ways to the Kindom


Matthew 13:31-53, selected verses



Jesus said, "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; in their joy they go and sell all that they have and buy that field."







Jesus said, "The kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding one pearl of great value, they went and sold all that they had and bought it."




Lord's Prayer



Helping Our Neighbors Now through August 16




Monday July 27 – Monday August 10

Weaving the Future

The National Youth Event (NYE), which met earlier this week at Purdue University in Indiana, brought together thousands of young people from across the United Church of Christ for a week of worship, fellowship and engaged service, built on 6 pillars. Justice

NYE lives into the mission of the United Church of Christ, sustained by grace, to build a just world for all.

Community Building

NYE sustains youth through community building and celebration of life, building strong connections for a lifetime journey.

Leadership

NYE cultivates the leadership of our youth, from its planning to realization, calling youth to create and problem solve towards a just world for all.
