



SUSTAINABILITY SEEKERS/STAFF and TENANTS JOIN FORCES TO IMPROVE PUCC RECYCLING PRACTICES

On August 25th PUCC Staff, Sustainability Seekers Committee, interested PUCC members and 5 tenants met in the Heritage Room with Jon Browne, who is our Republic Representative. We met for a little over an hour which included a very educational Power Point Presentation and time for Q&A.

Our goal was to relearn, as well as get caught up on the newest recycling practices that Republic is using. Some carriers have different guidelines, and some recycle more than others, so even though I'm attaching a Flyer here of Republic do's and dont's, if you use a carrier other than Republic, you may want to check with them for your own personal recycling "at home" use. It is our hope to improve the quality of our recycling here at Parkway so we do not "contaminate "our bins inside the building or what is ultimately dumped into the larger bin in our parking lot.

Our parking lot bins are solely for the use of our members, groups, kitchen activities, events etc. They are not meant for any outside or community groups. Many of you are involved in groups though that meet and use our facilities, so you should all be aware which bin is trash and which is recycling.



Please note there are 2 dumpsters in the back of the church. The one on the left (larger and colored blue with a blue top) is only for recycling and the one on the right (enclosed and with a gray/black top) is for trash only!!! DO NOT PUT TRASH IN THE BLUE TOPPED ONE ON THE LEFT we appreciate you following this rule as it creates many problems for us when it is ignored—please discuss this with all members of your group! If you have any questions, please let Kathy know.

These have been placed on the wall next to each location. Please follow the correct use of these signs and encourage others to do so.
