

**Scripture** Acts 1:1-14 | New Revised Standard Version—NRSV

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."


So, when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.



#### **Scripture** Luke 24:36b-53 | NRSV

Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence. Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what God promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

### **Sending the Word Home** For your spiritual nourishment during the week.

#### **LAST WEEK**

Paul describes perfect and self-giving love (1 Corinthians 13:1-13).

#### THIS WEEK

Paul focuses his teaching on clarifying the concept of resurrection, stating that it is not just a matter of raising from the dead but of new life in God's kingdom (1 Corinthians 15:1-26, 51-57).

#### THE POINT

We can rejoice since the risen Christ will destroy death forever.

#### **BIBLE NUTS & BOLTS**

Jesus' resurrection was a sign of the new beginning. Bible scholar N.T. Wright describes it this way: It was "the moment when the one true God appointed the man through whom the whole cosmos would be brought back into its proper order." With his resurrection, Jesus' reign has begun, but it is not yet complete. This is why we pray "Your kingdom come, your will be done" when we pray the Lord's Prayer. One day God will restore everything-death will be defeated forever and we will live in a restored and remade world. The Scriptures give us wonderful glimpses of that ultimate reality in places in both the Old and New Testaments. Look up Isaiah 2:1-4 and Revelation 21:3-5 for more pictures God has given us of the new creation.

#### **STORY SUMMARY**

As Paul winds down his letter to the Corinthians, he helps them face the reality of death. He shows them that Jesus' resurrection from the dead is important in the present and the future. He starts by reminding them that Jesus died and rose again. Paul tells them that Jesus' resurrection means something real: the defeat of death. It shows that Jesus is who he says he is, the Son of God and the deliverer the people of God had long expected. His resurrection introduced a new type of life in God's kingdom: a life we can begin to live in now and will one day live even more fully.

## PRACTICE: FELLOWSHIP

Those we fellowship with in God's kingdom today we will live with forever in God's eternal kingdom. Who in the Body of Christ can you celebrate life with this week? Call that person and count your blessings together.

#### **NEXT WEEK**

The Spirit gives each of us gifts so that, together, we can be a complete body of Christ (Acts 2:1-4; 1 Corinthians 12:1-13).

#### **GOING DEEPER**

As you hear and study these stories each week, consider what God has to say to you and your family. What is God's message to us? Consider the following basic pattern as a way of forming family devotions:

- ❖ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time." Pray a simple prayer together.
- Take a moment to check in with each other; what are each person's "highs" and "lows" today?
- \* Read aloud from the Daily Bible Readings from below. Discuss the questions following each.
- End with a blessing, by simply tracing a cross on each other's forehead. The Lord's Prayer is a good way to end your devotion time. If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotions.

**Note:** This is only a suggested pattern. It will vary with your household's context and patterns. What works best for you? First thing in the morning? Over breakfast? Bedtime? Be creative and flexible with how you practice and keep your devotions!

#### SUNDAY: 1 Corinthians 15:51-57

Death, the last enemy, is destroyed by Jesus. Do you feel hope or fear about the thought of death?

#### **MONDAY: 1 Corinthians 16:1-9**

Taking a collection for the saints. What would it look like for you to live more generously than you do now?

#### **TUESDAY: 1 Corinthians 16:10-14**

Timothy and Apollos do the work of the Lord. What can you do to help new people feel comfortable in your youth group?

#### WEDNESDAY: 1 Corinthians 16:15-24

Paul shares some final greetings. How does it feel when someone lets you know another person says hello? Who refreshes your spirit?

## **THURSDAY: 2 Corinthians 1:3-7**

Paul offers a prayer of thanksgiving. When have you been comforted? How can you pass along the comfort you have received to someone who needs comfort?

#### FRIDAY: 2 Corinthians 1:8-14

Paul experiences challenging times. How can you keep hope amidst struggles? For what do you rely fully on God?

#### **SATURDAY: Acts 2:1-4**

The Spirit comes at Pentecost. Who has shared the good news of Jesus with you? Who can you, with the help of the Spirit, tell about Jesus?

#### **May 2024 Alzheimer's News**

Blood tests: The Next Frontier in Alzheimer's Diagnosis. Blood tests for earlier detection of Alzheimer's disease are one of the most promising emerging areas in Alzheimer's research today. A study examined the use of blood-based biomarkers for Alzheimer's in primary care and compared them to diagnostic accuracy of primary care physicians. Results found that, after cognitive testing and a computed tomography (CT) scan or magnetic resonance imaging (MRI), PCPs correctly detected the presence of Alzheimer's -related brain changes or correctly diagnosed Alzheimer's in approximately 55% of cases, while blood tests did so in more than 85% of cases. This preliminary study demonstrates that blood tests for Alzheimer's have great potential for improving diagnostic accuracy and proper treatment of people living with Alzheimer's.
