Reading of Scripture

Epistle Lesson Listen for the word of God in 1 John | NRSV

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God’s love abide in anyone who has the world’s goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action.

We love because he first loved us. Those who say, “I love God,” and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

Here ends the Epistle lesson.

Gospel Lesson Listen to the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to John | NRSV
“I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as God knows me and I know God. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason God loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from God.”

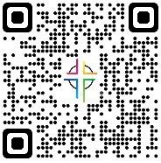
UCC Justice Moment

People misunderstand the disability called blindness and perceive things from the perspective of: “This is how I would do it” and just don’t understand that people who are blind, given the opportunity to be properly trained and have access to resources, can do most everything that anyone else can do — except see.

Join Jenny and her student and friend, Richie, as they share their stories about living with blindness, dispel stereotypes, ask for empathy and understanding, but not pity, and advocate for accessibility and inclusion at home, at work, and in the community.
