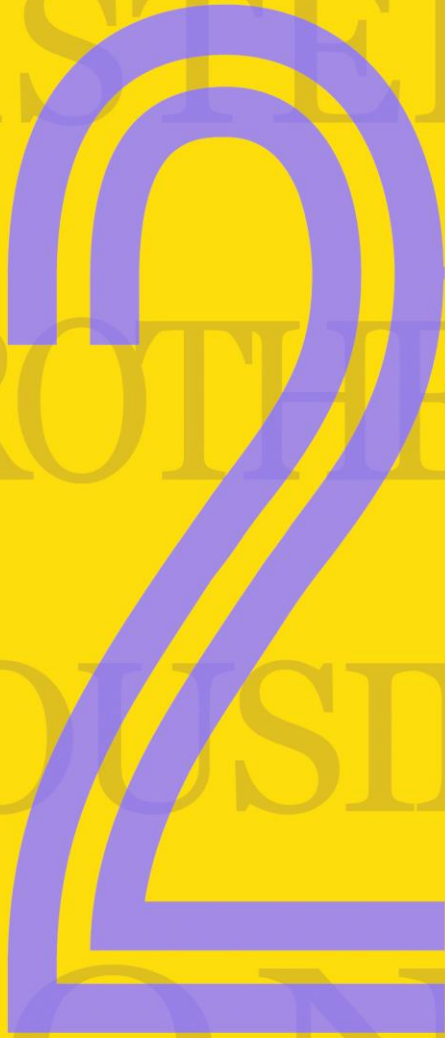

Then Jesus said, “There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said, ‘Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.’ So the father divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and traveled to a distant country. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said, ‘Father, I am no longer worthy to be called your son.’ But the father said to his slaves, ‘Quickly, bring out a robe—the best one—and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Jenny Carmack is a National Federation of the Blind first vice president and president of the Lewis and Clark National Federation of the Blind Chapter for St. Louis. Among other things, Jenny has run summer camps for blind kids for a number of years at Parkway Church.

People misunderstand the disability called blindness and perceive things from the perspective of: “This is how I would do it” and just don’t understand that people who are blind, given the opportunity to be properly trained and have access to resources, can do most everything that anyone else can do — except see.

Join Jenny and her student and friend, Richie, as they share their stories about living with blindness, dispel stereotypes, ask for empathy and understanding, but not pity, and advocate for accessibility and inclusion at home, at work, and in the community.
