

**Friends of Old Time (FOOT)** is an open community welcoming all that want to learn and play old time music and song. They meet here at Parkway UCC on the first and third Tuesday evenings, and at other locations during the month. Old-time music is a genre of North American folk music. It is played on acoustic instruments, generally centering on a combination of fiddle and plucked or strummed string instruments, most often the banjo, guitar, mandolin, mountain dulcimer, and upright bass. The story behind the old-time tune "Going Down to Cairo" is certainly specific to Illinois. In his book "Folk Songs and Singing Games of the Illinois Ozarks," David McIntosh said it comes from a "play party" circle dance for eight couples. In spite of its strong association with children's singing games, it traces back to Cairo's past as a wide-open river town when farmers shipped corn to market there by flatboat.

"It was pretty hard to find a good place to pass the time away so they began going to the saloons and various other places where they were entertained," said McIntosh's source for the song. "The women noticed on the return trips that the men 'blacked their boots' and dressed up a great deal more than usual and began to make frequent trips to Cairo."

As McCulloch heard the story, wives and girlfriends upriver didn't allow that situation to exist for very long. "As a result of this," he said, "many of the women began going with their husbands, and the manner of entertainment was somewhat changed."

McCulloch said the story traced back to a bad crop year in the 1850s. But Illinoisans had been going down to Cairo to buy and sell corn long before that – at least since the "deep snow" winter of 1831 when southern Illinois got to be known as Egypt by bible-quoting farmers who remembered the Book of Genesis and joked, "behold, there is corn in Egypt."

In January of this year, Parkway member, Sue Moellering travelled to El Salvador with twelve other people with ties to Eden Seminary. The trip was sponsored by International Partners in Mission ("IPM"), an organization that has been conducting these trips since 1974. It is NOT a vacation or a mission or volunteer opportunity. IPM describes the adventure as "Transformative Travel" that aims to create a powerful bond between the visitors and the people of El Salvador that can lead to social change.

The focus is on person-to-person cross cultural exchange. Participants walk in solidarity with communities their project partners serve. Sue will recount her experiences on the trip and its impact on her thereafter, along with insights into the people of El Salvador and their culture.

# PUCC Eco Stewards – August 2024

Well, PUCC, just when I try to explain exactly what Sustainability Seekers means, and how it's related to Environmental Stewardship, our team has decided to change our name to ECO STEWARDS!!! We are still seeking sustainability, but truthfully, we didn't like the acronym SS. It's just so much easier to write and say SS, and we don't like being called "SS". Eco-stewards are people or groups who use and protect the natural environment responsibly through conservation and sustainable practices1

Environmental stewardship, or Eco-stewards, conserves natural resources, combats pollution, and protects biodiversity, but most importantly, it means we protect and sustain our environment for future generations.

We realize they all mean the same thing, but because we don't like to be called SS, we are now Eco Stewards. Thank you for your understanding!!!

About our garden: you may have noticed that it looks a little baren recently, like there's a big chunk of flowers missing. Well, you're right, we had to pull out all the beautiful coneflowers. Our resident botanical expert, Julie Harms, noticed that the coneflowers had a disease called "Asters Yellow". This condition could spread to adjacent flowers and there is no cure. We will be replacing them with perhaps another type of plant, when the weather and conditions are right.

Quick facts:

- Aster yellows is a plant disease that can infect many plants.
- Infected plants have yellow leaves and stems, stunted growth and small malformed flowers.
- The aster leafhopper can carry the aster yellows pathogen. Plants become infected when fed on by leafhoppers carrying the pathogen.
- Once infected with aster yellows, a plant will never recover.
- Plants infected with aster yellows should be removed from growing areas and destroyed.
