

### UCC Justice Moments

#### 1973: Standing with farm workers

Meeting in St. Louis, the *UCC General Synod* suspends business after learning from Cesar Chavez that farm owners have unleashed a campaign of violence and beatings against strikers. The church flies delegates to Coachella Valley to show support.

#### 1973: Civil rights activists freed

*The Wilmington Ten* — 10 civil rights activists — are charged with the arson of a white-owned grocery store in Wilmington, North Carolina. One of them is Benjamin Chavis, a social justice worker sent by the UCC to Wilmington to help the African-American community overcome racial intolerance and intimidation. The UCC's *General Synod* raises bail. Chavis' conviction is overturned and he is released after spending four-and-a-half years in prison.

## **Speaker Series Occasional opportunities after worship at 11:15am "Well Bless my Soul (and Yours too)," by the Rev. Clint McCann.**

In many religious and philosophical traditions, the soul is the non-material essence of a person, which includes one's identity, personality, and memories; the essence of a living being that is believed to be able to survive physical death.

That is the general view, but what about a deeper dive? For that, we call upon Parkway mentor and friend, the Rev. Clint McCann to provide a further exploration and explanation of this soulful topic. Rev. McCann is the Evangelical Professor of Biblical Interpretation at Eden Seminary. He has authored books, is a widely acclaimed lecturer, and acts out his faith volunteering for social justice programs, such as CROP, Bread for the World, and Heifer International.

The historical novel is inspired by the true story of a woman physician in 15th -16th century China, the Ming Dynasty. It includes themes of gender roles, friendship, family hierarchies, and support systems. We'll discuss a third of the book over each of three meetings, September 3rd, 17th, and October 1st. Please join in at 1:45pm for fellowship or 2pm for discussion.

This book follows the fascinating true story of Lady Tan from childhood through adulthood as she navigates becoming a woman, and one of the first female doctors during 15th century China. The historical perspective of the book includes arranged marriages, foot binding, the justice system, and the roles of male physician and female midwife. In 1511, when Lady Tan turned fifty, she published a book of her medical cases. Interestingly, all of her cases were women and girls. Many of her remedies are still used in traditional Chinese medicine today. The author believes that Lady Tan was remarkable in her time period, and would be remarkable if she lived today.
