In brief essays, Renkl traces a tender and honest portrait of her unforgettable parents and of the bittersweet moments that accompany a child's transition to caregiver. Ringing with rapture and heartache, these essays convey the dignity of bluebirds and rat snakes, monarch butterflies and native bees. Let us know if you're carpooling or meeting at the house. Park on 15th Street for accessible access. An elevator is available for the tour, but the main bedroom requires climbing 16 steps. The Robert G. Campbell House, City Landmark #6, was built in 1851 for J.H. Hall by architect William Fulton. This three-story red brick and stucco house blends Greek Revival and Victorian townhouse styles. After Campbell purchased the lot next door in 1856, he added a carriage house and summer house. The house remained in his family until the 1930s, when it became a museum. It was designated a City Landmark in 1971.

December 2024 Alzheimer's News

A recent study has shown that a common cholesterol medication could help to slow the symptoms of Alzheimer's disease. The research, which was undertaken by scientists in Sweden, suggests that statin drugs could reduce congestion in the brain that leads to cognitive decline. Over three years, the researchers in Sweden looked at over 11,000 cases of people who were diagnosed with both dementia and heart issues that required them to take statin drugs. They found that the majority of these patients experienced mental decline at a lower rate than those who were not taking a statin, but the authors said another study was needed. Sara Garcia-Ptacek, an associate professor of neuroscience at the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm, said "The results of the study do not mean we now have evidence that people with dementia should be treated with statins. But on the other hand, we can't see any support for not doing so." Garcia-Ptacek added that a study looking at new data was needed, rather than just relying on the past data her team looked at.

In the Bible story about Noah, a rainbow is a sign of a promise by God-a covenant — between God and all living things on Earth. There is a rainbow Christmas tree in our Gathering Space, and it is filled with paper ornaments.
