
The Bread of Life . . . laid to sleep in a feeding trough.

The house remained in his family until the 1930s, when it became a museum. It was designated a City Landmark in 1971.

Even if the election results represent a setback for the environment, we are still seeing some good signs of progress. The Post-Dispatch on Sunday, December 1 ran a story reporting that the shift toward Electric Vehicles (EVs) is expected to roll on. It reports that a 1974 law limits presidential changes in vehicle requirements. There may be litigation or other pushback. Yet, there is also support for the jobs created by the EV industry. Several auto manufacturers have stated that the move toward sustainable fuel is inevitable. Manufacturers have spent \$160 billion just in the last few years on planning, designing, and building EVs. And there is political support. Many states have battery factories, EV facilities provide jobs, and the \$7,500 tax credit incentivizes purchases of EVs. It's a good thing for our environment.


