

Scripture Lesson Isaiah 60:1-6 | New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and this glory will appear over you. Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. Gospel Lesson Matthew 2:1-12 | Common English Bible (CEB)

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in the territory of Judea during the rule of King Herod, magi came from the east to Jerusalem. They asked, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We've seen his star in the east, and we've come to honor him."


When King Herod heard this, he was troubled, and everyone in Jerusalem was troubled with him. He gathered all the chief priests and the legal experts and asked them where the Christ was to be born. They said, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for this is what the prophet wrote:

"You, Bethlehem, land of Judah, by no means are you least among the rulers of Judah, because from you will come one who governs, who will shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod secretly called for the magi and found out from them the time when the star had first appeared. He sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search carefully for the child. When you've found him, report to me so that I too may go and honor him." When they heard the king, they went; and look, the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stood over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were filled with joy. They entered the house and saw the child with Mary his mother. Falling to their knees, they honored him. Then they opened their treasure chests and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Because they were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they went back to their own country by another route.

*Call to Worship

- One: Upon a midnight clear, Jesus was born. Angels bend near the earth to offer "Peace on earth, good will to all." Hear the angels sing!
- Many: They come with wonderful wings unfurled; and their heavenly music floats over all the world.

 - One: And the wise ones experience it and are drawn here. They follow the star and seek the holy embrace. They come with gifts.
- Many: We come too! We are drawn here. We have gifts to share and to receive.
 - All: Let us worship our God together Creator, Christ and Spirit.

We do not have gold, frankincense or myrrh to offer, but we do give our tangible gifts in hopes that the lives of those who struggle might be touched, that refugees might be honored, and that those searching might find a community with us. In the name of the Christ Child still being found today, we pray. Amen.

Scripture Matthew 2:1-12 | The Message (MSG)

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem village, Judah territory—this was during Herod's kingship—a band of scholars arrived in Jerusalem from the East. They asked around, "Where can we find and pay homage to the newborn King of the Jews? We observed a star in the eastern sky that signaled his birth. We're on pilgrimage to worship him."

When word of their inquiry got to Herod, he was terrified—and not Herod alone, but most of Jerusalem as well. Herod lost no time. He gathered all the high priests and religion scholars in the city together and asked, "Where is the Messiah supposed to be born?"

They told him, "Bethlehem, Judah territory. The prophet Micah wrote it plainly:

It's you, Bethlehem, in Judah's land, no longer bringing up the rear. From you will come the leader who will shepherd-rule my people, my Israel."

Herod then arranged a secret meeting with the scholars from the East. Pretending to be as devout as they were, he got them to tell him exactly when the birth-announcement star appeared. Then he told them the prophecy about Bethlehem, and said, "Go find this child. Leave no stone unturned. As soon as you find him, send word and I'll join you at once in your worship."

Instructed by the king, they set off. Then the star appeared again, the same star they had seen in the eastern skies. It led them on until it hovered over the place of the child. They could hardly contain themselves: They were in the right place! They had arrived at the right time!

They entered the house and saw the child in the arms of Mary, his mother. Overcome, they kneeled and worshiped him. Then they opened their luggage and presented gifts: gold, frankincense, myrrh.

In a dream, they were warned not to report back to Herod. So they worked out another route, left the territory without being seen, and returned to their own country.

Reflection

Scripture Matthew 2:13-23 | NRSV

When they had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up," he said, "take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him."

So he got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, where he stayed until the death of Herod. And so was fulfilled what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Out of Egypt I called my son."

When Herod realized that he had been outwitted by the Magi, he was furious, and he gave orders to kill all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity who were two years old and under, in accordance with the time he had learned from the Magi. Then what was said through the prophet Jeremiah was fulfilled:

"A voice is heard in Ramah, weeping and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children and refusing to be comforted, because they are no more."

After Herod died, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who were trying to take the child's life are dead."

So he got up, took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. Having been warned in a dream, he withdrew to the district of Galilee, and he went and lived in a town called Nazareth. So was fulfilled what was said through the prophets, that he would be called a Nazarene.





LAST WEEK in Sunday School

God chooses Mary to carry and give birth to the Messiah. Mary sings her gratitude (Luke 1:26-45 [46-56]).

TODAY in Sunday School

The infant Jesus is presented to God at the temple, where two prophets share the good news with others. Later, a child Jesus stays behind in Jerusalem, impressing the temple leaders (Luke 2:21-38; Luke 2:41-52).

THE POINT

At the temple, Jesus is announced as the savior of the world.

BIBLE NUTS & BOLTS

The Jewish religious leaders we read about in the Gospels are not always well understood in our churches today. Priests led worship in the temple by making sacrifices and other offerings. Scribes were well educated and made copies of scrolls like the Torah. The leaders generally belonged to one of two groups. The Pharisees believed that the most important thing to do was to follow the rules found in the Law and the Prophets (our Old Testament). The Sadducees focused on worship in the temple.

STORY SUMMARY

Mary and Joseph follow the Torah laws and custom for the firstborn son and present Jesus to God in the temple. The Holy Spirit sends Simeon to visit the temple where Simeon confirms Jesus' identity as God's salvation for the world. Another prophet at the temple, Anna, shares this news with all those who are looking forward to the Messiah. She reveals Jesus as savior. When Jesus is 12, and his family journeys home after the Passover festival, Jesus stays behind at the temple. Rather than following his earthly parents to their home, he spends time in his heavenly parent's house, discussing Scripture with the Jewish leaders. As a baby and as a young boy, Jesus' identity as the savior and Son of God is revealed at the temple.

PRACTICE: Worship

Find Luke 2:30-32 and repeat it for an extended time of worship. As you do, take time to focus the worship on various parts of the passage: salvation and what it means to you, God having prepared deliverance for the world, and Jesus as the light not for one people group but for all. Worship God for God's love, for God's plan, for God's care for all, and for the revelation of God's Son.

NEXT WEEK in Sunday School

John the Baptist prepares people to follow Jesus. When he baptizes Jesus, Jesus is proclaimed as the Son of God (Luke 3:1-22).

GOING DEEPER

As you hear and study these stories each week, consider what God has to say to you and your family. What is God's message to us? Consider the following basic pattern as a way of forming family devotions:

- Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time." Pray a simple prayer together.
- Take a moment to check in with each other; what are each person's "highs" and "lows" today?
- Read aloud from the Daily Bible Readings from below. Discuss the questions following each.
- End with a blessing, by simply tracing a cross on each other's forehead. The Lord's Prayer is a good way to end your devotion time. If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotions.

Note: This is only a suggested pattern. It will vary with your household's context and patterns. What works best for you? First thing in the morning? Over breakfast? Bedtime? Be creative and flexible with how you practice and keep your devotions!

DAILY BIBLE READINGS

SUNDAY: Luke 2:41-52

Jesus is missing! If you were separated from your family because you stayed back at an area of interest, where would they find you?

MONDAY: Genesis 17:9-14

God requires a sign of the covenant. To demonstrate the keeping of the covenant with God, males were circumcised. How do you show your commitment to God today?

TUESDAY: Exodus 13:1-2

The firstborn is consecrated to God. What does this reveal about the place God wants in our lives?

WEDNESDAY: Leviticus 26:3-6

God grants peace when God's ways are kept. What does this tell us about the concept of "you reap what you sow?"

THURSDAY: Leviticus 26:7-13

The covenant is revealed. How does your life demonstrate that you know you belong to God?

FRIDAY: Malachi 4:4-6

Advice is given regarding the coming of the Lord. How deliberately do you follow God's ways?

SATURDAY: Isaiah 62:10-12

Isaiah proclaims the coming salvation. What does it mean to be a holy people? How does it feel to be sought by the Lord?

In the pre-antibiotic days when tuberculosis stirred people's darkest fears, killing one in seven, white nurses at Sea View, New York's largest municipal hospital, began quitting en masse. Desperate to avert a public health crisis, city officials summoned Black southern nurses, luring them with promises of good pay, a career, and an escape from the structures of Jim Crow. But after arriving, they found themselves on an isolated hilltop in the remote borough of Staten Island, yet again confronting racism and consigned to a woefully understaffed sanatorium. The book spans the Great Depression and moves through World War II and beyond. This true story follows the intrepid young women known by their patients as the "Black Angels." This book celebrates their legacy and spirit of survival.

TAD will read and discuss the book in 3 sessions, starting January 7, where we'll discuss section 1 of the book. Join in at 1:45pm for fellowship, or 2pm for book discussion.

Please join us for our book discussion of *The Extraordinary Life of Sam Hell* by Robert Dugoni. But did you know that this day is one of only two Congressionally Designated Days of Service, the other being September 11th? In 1994, President Bill Clinton signed the King Holiday and Service Act into law, 26 years after Dr. King's assassination. Dr. King envisioned a "Beloved Community," where people from all walks of life uplift each other. The Act calls Americans to take action and improve their communities. Acts of kindness don't need to be limited to one day or organization. Simple gestures, like helping a neighbor with snow or offering a kind note, can create a lasting impact. Here are some ideas to spark your next act of kindness or plan for community involvement:

- Volunteer to be a book reader at your local elementary school and read a children's book about Dr. King or another activist
- Sign up to volunteer with Meals on Wheels America, an organization dedicated to addressing senior isolation and hunger
- Find a local volunteer opportunity through AmeriCorps Volunteer Search.
- Check out the MLK Day of Service website to find volunteer opportunities dedicated to celebrating Dr. King
