

Scripture Luke 5:1-11 | New Revised Standard Version

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch."

Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing... Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets."

When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon.

Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.



February 2025 Alzheimer's News

Blood Test Research Findings Presented at the 2024 Alzheimer's Association International Conference showed that a blood test, when combined with a thorough clinical evaluation by primary care doctors or specialists, can help to more accurately diagnose Alzheimer's Disease. Specialists and primary care doctors were both around 90% accurate in identifying Alzheimer's Disease using the blood test. Previously, specialists not using blood tests were only 73% accurate, while primary care doctors were only 63% accurate. If clinical studies continue to demonstrate the accuracy and value of blood tests in both research and clinical settings, blood tests could reduce the need for expensive and painful lumbar punctures and PET Scans used to diagnose Alzheimer's in the early stages.

The team reviewed cover letters and resumes of applicants. They invited some candidates to answer three questions about our particular PUCC mission and ministry. The team arranged two face to face interviews: a traditional interview around a table with team members asking all kinds of questions and engaging in thoughtful conversation - the second in the sanctuary as a music skills experience and then back to the table to have more sharing of experiences, ideas and dreams. References were contacted and a thorough background check was done through PUCC's insurance company. We put a pause on the search for a choir director at this time as we re-evaluate our Sunday morning music.

Amy is our search team's choice from both a musical and personality standpoint. She is an intelligent and talented artist. Her credentials reflect her commitment to higher education to improve her musical skills. With a bachelor's degree from Baylor University and a master's degree from the University of Dallas, Amy demonstrates a focus on continuous improvement in musical adaptability and performance enhancement.

One of her references states that she is a kind, lovely, and dedicated person and puts great care into any task she undertakes.

Amy is also a cellist and teaches private piano lessons... she plays the ukelele too!

Amy shared with us that "music, which is one of my life's greatest joys, helps me maintain my sanity amidst life's difficulties."

As we begin this next chapter, we're seeking people to join our music program. We're looking for individuals willing to sing a solo, duet, trio, or to sing seasonally (Advent/Christmas or Lent/Easter) and/or to sing with a group monthly with the First Sunday Choir at 9am.
