




Scripture Psalm 1 | Inclusive Language Psalter







There are over 12,000 children in foster care in Missouri, with more than 5,000 in the St. Louis area. Being separated from family is deeply traumatic for children. CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) volunteers provide consistent, supportive adult presence for children in foster care. They work with case workers and the Court to ensure the child's needs are met. While case workers and placements may change, the child's CASA remains a steady, reliable figure. Helen Race, a Parkway member, has been a CASA for over 5 years and finds the experience both meaningful and impactful. February Eco Steward Article A brief history of Shannondale UCC

Is it new or unusual for a UCC church to actively promote its environment and community? Apparently not, based on a recent article in Missouri Times, the newsletter of the State Historical Society of Missouri. The article tells the story of Shannondale United Church of Christ in Shannon County over the last 100 years.

The rural Ozark community of Shannondale was primitive in 1929, when Vincent Bucher first went there and assisted that church's pastor. Bucher later became pastor of the church, a few years after its stone sanctuary was built in 1932. At the time there was no electricity or running water for his family and for most area residents.

Rev. Bucher actively worked "to not only minister to the community's spiritual needs, but also to help its members earn a sustainable living." Northern

Shannon County consisted of mostly hills and rocks, "a result of years of clear-cutting timber followed by fires, erosion, and barren patches of land." Rev. Bucher actively worked to improve the environment, with composting and careful plantings. Also, he, the church, or others in the community (it's not clear from the article) purchased 4,000 acres of clear-cut timberland, replanted it, and turned it into a sustainable source of income.

The Bucher's left in 1967, but Shannondale UCC still meets weekly in its historic rock church, it remains actively involved in community affairs, "and the forest continues to provide income to those engaged in cooperative work in the Shannon County community," according to the article.

The team arranged two face to face interviews: a traditional interview around a table with team members asking all kinds of questions and engaging in thoughtful conversation - the second in the sanctuary as a music skills experience and then back to the table to have more sharing of experiences, ideas and dreams. References were contacted and a thorough background check was done through PUCC's insurance company. We put a pause on the search for a choir director at this time as we re-evaluate our Sunday morning music.

Amy is our search team's choice from both a musical and personality standpoint. She is an intelligent and talented artist. Her credentials reflect her

commitment to higher education to improve her musical skills. With a bachelor's degree from Baylor University and a master's degree from the University of Dallas, Amy demonstrates a focus on continuous improvement in musical adaptability and performance enhancement.

One of her references states that she is a kind, lovely, and dedicated person and puts great care into any task she undertakes.

Amy is also a cellist and teaches private piano lessons... she plays the ukelele too!

Amy shared with us that "music, which is one of my life's greatest joys, helps me maintain my sanity amidst life's difficulties."

LAST WEEK in Sunday School

Jesus continues his radical work by reaching out to a Gentile and a widow, healing one who are sick and raising a man from the dead, offering life to people on the outskirts of society (Luke 7:1-17).

TODAY in Sunday School

John the Baptist sends his disciples to Jesus asking the question on everyone's mind: are you the Messiah? Jesus points to his miracles and then tells the crowd that John was a prophet (Luke 7:18-35).

THE POINT

Jesus is the Messiah, who proclaims God's kingdom as John did.

BIBLE NUTS & BOLTS

What do miracle stories teach us about Jesus? The miracle stories can be divided into three groups. Healing stories where Jesus heals a person who has been experiencing a severe illness or physical disability-even death. Exorcisms involve a personified evil, such as a demon. Natural miracles are events when Jesus exerts power over nature, such as calming the sea or multiplying loaves and fish. These miracles tell us about Jesus' love for those in need, his power over the forces of sin and evil, and his command over nature.

STORY SUMMARY

Having heard about Jesus' activities from his own followers, John the Baptist sends messengers to Jesus to ask him if he is indeed the Messiah they are waiting for. When they were with Jesus, John's messengers witnessed Jesus heal many people and cast out demons. Jesus was not what people were expecting the Messiah to be like. Instead of a mighty king ready for battle, the Messiah was a humble man concerned with the most marginalized people in society. Jesus also teaches the crowd that John was a great prophet, the forerunner of the Messiah

PRACTICE: Prayer

At its heart, prayer is simply expressing yourself to God, and being open to hear God's expression to you. Some people express themselves best not with spoken words, but through writing. This week, practice writing your prayers out. A prayer journal can help you keep track of how God is working in your life and how you are growing in faith.

NEXT WEEK in Sunday School

While Jesus was visiting a Pharisee, a woman who was called "sinful" by others wept at Jesus' feet and anointed them with expensive oil. Jesus give her mercy and forgiveness. (Luke 7:36-50).
