


**Scripture** Deuteronomy 26:1-11 | New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us." When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, you shall make this response before the Lord your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power,

and with signs and wonders; and brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me." You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.


#### **Lenten Candles:** Traveling with Jesus

We lit seven candles on Ash Wednesday as we embarked on this Lenten journey. We want the light of the Holy to illumine our path as we seek to be the words and ways of Jesus. We commit to being more infused by the Spirit as we travel. Even as we know this is good and important work, we recognize that it isn't easy—and we will come upon the shadow side of humanity and some of our own unique darkness.

We extinguish one candle each time we worship this season, acknowledging that this can be tough and exhausting work. As we approach the desertion and depletion of Good Friday, we also prepare ourselves for the dawn and love of Easter morning... the light and love of God that never goes out.

#### **Prayer at the Candles**

Holy One, we travel this Lenten journey, knowing that you are with us every step of the way, wherever we find ourselves... feeling overwhelmed in wooly wildernesses and devastating wastelands; heading down off-ramps and appreciating detours; seeking balance and eye-contact on see-saws; experiencing safety in hometowns and heartfelt spaces; refreshing at leisure sites; memory gazing in places of the past; toiling in vineyards and other workplaces; committing to community centers; venturing to places we've never been; stopping in someone else's home; meandering well-traveled roads or taking the road less-traveled; seeking perspective in cemeteries; waltzing in the front door or coming around the secret entrance; surviving in a chaotic courtroom or learning in a crowded classroom; pulling up a chair at a welcome table; grieving in gardens; or envisioning future places where You are already waiting for us. We make this journey to be with Jesus and to become more like him. Send Your Spirit to help us along the way.

#### Scripture Luke 4:1-13 | Common English Bible (CEB)

Jesus returned from the Jordan River full of the Holy Spirit, and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness. There he was tempted for forty days by the devil. He ate nothing during those days and afterward Jesus was starving. The devil said to him, "Since you are God's Son, command this stone to become a loaf of bread."





#### **March Alzheimer's News**

The surprising relationship between vaccinations and Alzheimer's Disease: Receiving routine vaccinations against common infections like tetanus. shingles and pneumonia may offer an unexpected benefit: a reduced risk of developing Alzheimer's disease later in life. A study found that older adults who received these vaccines were less likely to be diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease compared to their unvaccinated peers over an eight-year period. This research adds to a growing body of evidence suggesting that vaccinations could play a role in protecting against this devastating brain disease. There is a growing theory that infections might play a role in the development of Alzheimer's. The idea is that infections can cause inflammation in the brain, and this inflammation could contribute to the brain cell damage seen in Alzheimer's. Vaccines are designed to prevent infections. Future research is needed to confirm these findings and to better understand the underlying mechanism. Ideally, prospective studies, which follow people forward in time and track their vaccination status and development of Alzheimer's disease would provide even stronger evidence. #### **LAST WEEK in Sunday School**

Jesus takes three disciples up a mountain, where he becomes dazzlingly white, and Moses and Elijah appear next to him. God declares that Jesus is God's Son, and the disciples should listen to him (Luke 9:28-45).

#### **TODAY in Sunday School**

Jesus tells the Parable of the Good Samaritan, in which a person cares for his enemy. Then, Jesus visits sisters Mary and Martha and encourages Martha to rest from her work and listen to him (Luke 10:25-42).

#### THE POINT

God's kingdom appears in acts of mercy and love.

#### **BIBLE NUTS & BOLTS**

The Jewish people were biased against the Samaritans. The Samaritan people had a different culture and a different, though related, religion. The Jewish people saw the Samaritans as the "other," and therefore relationships with the two peoples were often hostile. Knowing about the conflict between these cultures helps us understand how radical Jesus' teaching is about breaking boundaries emphasizing the importance of learning about the culture and customs of the time.

#### STORY SUMMARY

Jewish people in the first century hated Samaritans—who lived in a territory between Galilee and Judea—due to historical differences and animosity. The Jews would have nothing to do with them and even travel farther to avoid their territory. Yet, in this story, it is a Samaritan who stops to help a Jewish man in need. Jesus tells his listeners to follow the example of the Samaritan.

Then, Jesus breaks the rules by meeting with women on their own turf with no other man present, and he expects them to learn just like his male disciples do. It is a shocking story from the perspective of the people of Jesus' time.

#### **PRACTICE: Service**

When we answer the call to serve, we just might find ourselves face to face with people we do not normally associate with. It can be a challenge to remember that we do service together with others, not just for them. Find a way to get to know someone in your community who needs help. Some places to check are other churches, shelters, or social service offices.

#### **NEXT WEEK in Sunday School**

Jesus tells people that bad things do not happen because of people's sins, but he calls the people to change their ways. Then, he tells some Pharisees that he is going to Jerusalem be killed (Luke 13:1-9, 31-35).

For my life is spent with sorrow, and my years with sighing; my strength fails because of my misery, and my bones waste away. I am the scorn of all my adversaries, a horror to my neighbors, an object of dread to my acquaintances; those who see me in the street flee from me. I have passed out of mind like one who is dead; I have become like a broken vessel. For I hear the whispering of many terror all around! as they scheme together against me, as they plot to take my life. But I trust in you, O Lord: I say, "You are my God." My times are in your hand; deliver me from the hand of my enemies and persecutors.

Let your face shine upon your servant; save me in your steadfast love.
Do not let me be put to shame, O Lord, for I call on you; let the wicked be put to shame; let them go dumbfounded to Sheol.
Let the lying lips be stilled that speak insolently against the righteous with pride and contempt.

O how abundant is your goodness that you have laid up for those who fear you, and accomplished for those who take refuge in you, in the sight of everyone!

In the shelter of your presence you hide them from human plots; you hold them safe under your shelter from contentious tongues.

Blessed be the Lord, for he has wondrously shown his steadfast love to me when I was beset as a city under siege.

I had said in my alarm,

"I am driven far from your sight."

But you heard my supplications when I cried out to you for help.

Love the Lord, all you his saints. The Lord preserves the faithful, but abundantly repays the one who acts haughtily. Be strong, and let your heart take courage, all you who wait for the Lord.
