


***Lenten Candles** Traveling with Jesus


Scripture Luke 13:6-9

He went on his way. We all do, afterward; it's the only choice the living have. I just hope he eventually found some time, and some people, for healing.

LAST WEEK in Sunday School

Jesus tells people that bad things do not happen because of people's sins, but he calls the people to change their ways. Then, he tells some Pharisees that he is going to Jerusalem be killed (Luke 13:1-9, 31-35).

TODAY in Sunday School

Jesus tells parables about a lost sheep, a lost coin, and a lost son. God never stops seeking people who feel lost or have wandered from God's way. When someone returns, all the angels celebrate (Luke 15:1-32).

THE POINT

God celebrates when the lost are found and those who were dead find life.

BIBLE NUTS & BOLTS

Parables are more than just stories with a moral or some kind of fairy tale we might remember from our childhood. Parables help us understand the truth about ourselves and the world using familiar images, exaggeration, plot twists, and symbolism. Jesus had to give his disciples private explanations before they understood these stories. We can seek help to understand the meaning of parables.

PRACTICE: Service

We are reminded that God celebrates when those who are lost are found or those who were abandoned are helped. As a family, take some time to look up youth services in your community. For every organization you found, find a list of the things they need from volunteers. Choose an organization and gather any of the items on their list. Bring them to the organization this week.

STORY SUMMARY

Many feel lost in this world for reasons beyond just not knowing the physical directions to a place. Jesus reminds us that God is willing to do what it takes to find them, even if it means something crazy. And, then, when they are found, it is time to party.

Jesus tells of a shepherd who searched for one lost sheep. He tells of a woman who lost one of her silver coins. Not only did she search for the coin, but she rejoiced when she found it. Jesus tells of a wayward son whose father longed for his return and celebrated the day his son came home. In the same way, Jesus longs for us to come to him. All of heaven rejoices when we do.

NEXT WEEK in Sunday School

Jesus tells a story of a rich man and a poor man named Lazarus. They both die, and while Lazarus is comforted, the rich man suffers (Luke 16:19-31).

GOING DEEPER

As you hear and study these stories each week, consider what God has to say to you and your family. What is God's message to us? Consider the following basic pattern as a way of forming family devotions:

- Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time." Pray a simple prayer together.
- Take a moment to check in with each other; what are each person's "highs" and "lows" today?
- Read aloud from the Daily Bible Readings from below. Discuss the questions following each.
- End with a blessing, by simply tracing a cross on each other's forehead. The Lord's Prayer is a good way to end your devotion time. If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotions.

Note: This is only a suggested pattern. It will vary with your household's context and patterns. What works best for you? First thing in the morning? Over breakfast? Bedtime? Be creative and flexible with how you practice and keep your devotions!

SUNDAY: Luke 15:1-32

Anyone who feels lost can trust that not only will God search until they are found, but there will be a celebration in heaven. How can you help find someone who is lost?

MONDAY: Psalm 119:169-176

God promises to take care of us. What are some ways you can keep learning about God's word?

TUESDAY: 1 Samuel 16:6-13

God chose a shepherd to be a great leader of the nations. How does trusting God like a shepherd make you feel secure?

WEDNESDAY: Genesis 45:1-9

Tossed aside by his brothers, Joseph ended up living an amazing adventure. When have you experienced the joy of gathering with friends and family?

THURSDAY: Genesis 45:21-28

Jacob experienced a resurrection of sorts when he found his son Joseph alive and well in another part of the world. How can you celebrate each day as if you have been given another chance to thrive?

FRIDAY: Exodus 2:1-10

Moses should not have survived being born. He was in danger from the Pharoh. But God had other plans, and Moses became an important leader.

SATURDAY: John 4:46-54

We do not need signs and wonders to have faith. What kind of prayers can you offer for those in need?

Marsha P. Johnson. Sylvia Rivera. Christine Jorgensen. Laverne Cox. Elliot Page. Sarah McBride. Zooey Zephyr. SJ Howell. Wick Thomas. As we approach **Transgender Day of Visibility**, it's appropriate we think of the people who have made an impact on the trans community and beyond.

Each year on March 31, the world observes Transgender Day of Visibility (TDOV) to raise awareness about transgender people. Created in 2010 by trans advocate Rachel Crandall in response to the slew of negative media stories about transgender people, TDOV is a day to celebrate the lives and contributions of trans people, while drawing attention to the challenges faced.

Johnson and Rivera were present at the Stonewall uprising in 1969 and became leaders in the early LGBTQ+ rights movement. Jorgensen was the first person to be widely known in the U.S. to have gender-affirming surgery. Actors Cox and Page continue to advocate for trans people by sharing their stories and celebrity. And in the political arena, McBride is the first trans woman to serve in Congress, while state legislators Zephyr and Howell serve their constituents in Montana and advocate for LGBTQ+ rights. Missouri Rep. Wick Thomas from Jackson County is the first non-binary person elected to serve in Jefferson City. Thomas is a member of the new Equality Caucus, a group of Democrats that advocate for the rights of LGBTQ+ Missourians.

Missouri can be a difficult place to live for our LGBT+ citizens. So far in 2025, 56 anti-LGBTQ+ bills, many targeting trans citizens, have been introduced by Republican representatives and senators. These bills seek to put bathroom bans into place, forbid public drag shows, end gender-affirming health care, keep trans athletes from playing on their school's sports teams, and restricting a person's ability to update gender on state-issued IDs.

As followers of Jesus, we can show compassion and care for trans siblings while we advocate for their rights. Several opportunities will be forthcoming...

- *** March 30, our Jesus Has Left the Building Sunday will feature opportunities to serve the trans and LGBTQ+ community. Opportunities at church will include creating and/or addressing cards of encouragement for parents of trans children that will be distributed through two local chapters of TransParent USA. An advocacy corner will include postcards to address to your Congressional representatives.

- *** March 31 There will be a fundraiser from 4-9pm at Steve's Hot Dogs, 3145 S. Grand Blvd., to benefit PROMO Missouri and TransParent. Music bingo, trivia, and a silent auction will be a part of this evening.
