June Alzheimer's News

As Alzheimer's disease now affects seven million Americans—the largest number ever—demand for new treatments grows. Scientists at the University of California, Irvine, have discovered a "groundbreaking" therapy using stem cells to "program" human immune cells, called microglia, to counteract dementia signs, according to UCI. Microglia, the brain's primary defense against infection and injury, were engineered via CRISPR gene editing to produce neprilysin, an enzyme that breaks down toxic beta-amyloid plaques linked to Alzheimer's. "Delivering biologics to the brain is challenging due to the blood-brain barrier," said co-author Mathew Blurton-Jones. "We've developed a programmable delivery system residing in the brain that activates only when needed." These cells precisely target amyloid plaques, making the treatment effective yet focused. Salinas, not involved in the study, noted the approach limits harm to healthy tissue and reduces side effects by concentrating on therapy where damage occurs.

Researchers now aim for human trials, potentially using patients' own stem cells to minimize immune rejection. "More research is needed to understand how this delivery method could impact those living with or at risk for Alzheimer's," she added.

Different Places, Same People?

Now those who had been scattered by the persecution that broke out when Stephen was killed traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, spreading the word only among Jews. Some of them, however—men from Cyprus and Cyrene—went to Antioch and began to speak to the Greeks also, telling them the good news about the Lord Jesus. The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord. - Acts 11:19-21 (NIV)

Ever notice how we can travel to different cities, states, even countries, and still gravitate toward the same kind of people that we left back home?

Let's face it, we all tend to feel more comfortable with persons who fit a certain profile in our minds, and these are the people that we seek out, no matter where we go, often to the exclusion of others. Could this explain why cultural diversity and intercultural exchange need intentional effort? Could this have anything to do with the demonization of Muslims by some Christians or the attacks upon transgender people by some cisgender persons or the disdain for Hispanic immigrants by some Americans or the fear of diversity by some politicians?

Some of us only build community with our own kind. But thank God, there are others of us who see God in strangers as much as we see God in our own kin.

When the first-century persecution of Christians in Jerusalem forced the early disciples out of the city into different places, not all of them took advantage of the Christian diaspora to reach out to different people. Some, however, decided to cross the cultural divide and build community with the Greeks. It was a bold, risky endeavor, but according to Acts, "The Lord's hand was with them."

We can be sure that whenever we break down the barriers that separate us from others and promote human unity in the midst of cultural diversity, God always has a hand in it.

Prayer:

Lord, we thank you for sending us to so many different places. Now, please help us to encounter you and embrace you in the faces of all the people who seem like strangers to us. Amen.
