# Advocacy panel Oct. 27

As the LGBTQ+ Faith Alliance comes to the end of its programming year, the October meeting will focus on equipping faith communities to become effective advocates. On Monday, Oct. 27, at 7 p.m. (note the different start time), we will gather at Kirkwood United Methodist Church (201 W. Adams) for an educational panel, "For Such a Time as This."



We are currently working to complete the panel, but so far, our panelists will include:

- Jeanette Mott Oxford, former Missouri House Representative for District 59, who has made a career advocating for a more equitable Missouri through her work with Empower Missouri, Metropolitan Congregations United, and Paraquad. She remains an active advocate in her retirement. In July, she organized attendees of the United Church of Christ Open & Affirming Coalition's convention in Kansas City in a public witness march, joining others for a teach-in addressing the urgent issues facing LGBTQ+ and other marginalized communities in Missouri and across the nation.
- Rev. Meagan McLaughlin, pastor at Christ Lutheran (ELCA) Church, traveled to Jefferson City this year to testify against anti-trans bills before a House committee. She is an active member of Proclaim, a ministry of Extraordinary Lutheran Ministries, an organization connected with the ELCA that supports, encourages, and advocates for LGBTQIA+ seminarians and clergy in the ELCA.

Panelists will share stories from their advocacy experiences in Jefferson City, offer tips for organizing peaceful protests or vigils, effective communication practices, and more. If you've ever asked, "what can I do?" we will have the answers at this educational event, as well as helpful handouts and easy actionable items to do on site. We'll also be collecting food to help Metro Trans Umbrella Group restock its pantry. Pop-top canned goods are preferred and may include fruit, tuna, chicken, soup, and microwavable meals. Shelf-stable milk (including plant-based milks) and snacks (chips, granola bars, etc) also are needed.

# Religious Archives

"History is written from the perspective of those who preserve their records."

This quote has a prominent place at a unique virtual library based in Chicago, Illinois, the **LGBTQ Religious Archives Network**. And as congregations prepare to observe LGBTQ+ History Month, this could be a useful resource to clergy or justice teams.

The website, <a href="https://lgbtqreligiousarchives.org">https://lgbtqreligiousarchives.org</a>, has oral histories a profile gallery of leaders who helped shape LGBTQ+ religious movements, and a collection of documents. Search the collection by faith, people, subjects, organizations or geography. As an example, click on the



preserving history tab/profiles/
geography and select Missouri to find
profiles of people such Rev. Carol
Cureton, founder of the MCC of
Greater St. Louis, as well as Rt. Rev.
Deon Johnson, bishop of the Episcopal
Diocese of St. Louis.

But the network also presents current events and will hold an online gala, "Holy Troublemakers," on Oct. 19. See the website for details.
