Mission Moment *Every Child's Hope*

We receive an annual offering for the important work that has been happening here in St Louis with vulnerable children and families since 1858. It all started when former Parkway UCC Pastor Louis Nollau sheltered a young boy named Henry Sam. The orphanage, originally known as the German Protestant Orphan's Home, was incorporated in 1861 and moved to a farm in St. Louis County in 1866. It has stayed with the times as it has kept to its mission to care for kids of all ages.

In addition to prayers, this congregation founded by German immigrant farmers would fill a pickup truck with bounty from their harvests and nurture the bodies, minds and spirits of the children at ECH. We continue to pray and act on their behalf. Remember the children/teens through the holidays.

Just Human: Transgender Lives in the 2020s

TODAY | 2pm | 2525 S. Jefferson Ave; St Louis, MO 63104

Anti-trans hostility has grown beyond state legislatures to our national government. Increasingly, oppressive laws and court decisions are being accompanied by threats and violence against the trans community and allies.

How can a small group of people come together for positive change?

One way is to use theatre and individual stories of joy and challenge to counter the dehumanizing effects of scapegoating. Jamie Linsin is a clinical psychologist who wrote *Just Human* based on over 30 interviews with transgender persons, their parents, healthcare providers, and advocates.

LGBTQ+ news for November

November is Trans Awareness Month, which brings attention to the experiences of the transgender, nonbinary, and gender non-conforming communities. From the United Church of Christ ~ "Our faith teaches us that transgender, nonbinary, and intersex people are beloved children of God. Since January, this community has come under attack by our federal government: banned from serving in the military and fired from positions in the federal government; prohibited from playing on school sports teams; cut off from lifesaving, gender-affirming care."

Recently, the Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson, General Minister and President of our United Church of Christ, joined several other interfaith leaders in a joint statement that said in part:

As heads of diverse religious traditions in the United States, our faiths call on us to proclaim that transgender, intersex, and nonbinary people deserve respect, love, and equal rights. During a time when our country is placing their lives under increasingly serious threat, there is a disgraceful

misperception that people of faith don't affirm the full spectrum of gender. Let it be known instead that our beloveds are created in the image of God – Holy and whole.

While these public declarations are necessary, we must also back up our words with actions of solidarity and love. Here are three opportunities to support our St. Louis trans community:

- Sign a pledge to defend trans rights in Missouri with PROMO, the state's LGBTQ+ advocacy and public policy agency.
- Metro Trans Umbrella Group (MTUG) is our area's biggest support organization for trans, genderqueer, intersex, and androgynous people. Recently, PUCC partnered with PFLAG's mid-county chapter to collect food every month for MTUG's pantry. Other volunteer opportunities are listed on the MTUG web site.
- Have "that" conversation when you hear a person supporting the denial of gender-affirming care for youth or normalize sport or bathroom bans. If you need some guidance, TransParent USA has a page of educational resources for you. Even a simple statement such as, "I have loved ones who are trans (or genderqueer, intersex) and your statement is very hurtful to me. My loved one is a beloved child of God and is deserving of all human rights as everyone else," can be a powerful witness in a moment. ~Deb Reinhardt, ONA Team

Missouri History Museum Exhibit: *Mill Creek Black Metropolis*

Thursday, December 11 | 10am-2pm | 5700 Lindell Boulevard, St. Louis, 63112
Please join the Adventurers on a trip to the Missouri History Museum. We'll meet at the church at 9:30am for carpooling, or at 10am at the Museum (5700 Lindell Boulevard). We'll tour the new *Mill Creek: Black Metropolis* exhibit, among other things. (More details to come.) Afterward, the group will head to lunch at a place to be determined. Come join in on the fun and meet some other PUCCers.

From its origin at the turn of the 20th century to its destruction in 1959 in the name of urban renewal, Mill Creek Valley was a center for Black life in St. Louis. With a population of nearly 20,000 people and more than 5,000 buildings, Mill Creek was a city within a city, noted for its vibrant commercial life, rich culture, and popular entertainment venues. How is it, then, that almost no trace of Mill Creek remains in St. Louis today? *Mill Creek: Black Metropolis* explores the rich history of a St. Louis neighborhood that historians have likened to New York's legendary Harlem. It was the home of St. Louis's major Black newspapers, the offices of numerous Black professionals, a center of social activism, and the birthplace of ragtime. All this richness thrived amid and despite racial segregation, providing African Americans common ground and the refuge from the daily slights and indignities of a stark color divide in 20th-century St. Louis. Little Red Hen Mode

Then [Jesus] said to his disciples, “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few, therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.” - Matthew 9:37-38 (ESV)

One of my fatal flaws is thinking it all depends on me: my labor, my know-how, my commitment to getting the job done. I call this Little Red Hen mode.

Remember her? She sowed the seed, weeded the field, harvested and milled the grain, baked the bread, inviting her fellow farm animals into the work at every step. They begged off, but when they smelled that bread baking, they sure came running.

The hen let them watch while she carbo-loaded that whole loaf by herself. I would never. Instead, I would feed everybody while harboring bitterness that no one had helped me along the way.

My church recently made a big thing happen: creating an emergency shelter for LGBTQ+ asylum seekers. I was overwhelmed with many tasks and found it hard to delegate. Among other things, we needed new mattresses.

An agency gave me the name of a mattress store that might be willing to donate. I almost didn't call. I feared red tape and, frankly, rejection: either because we were a church or because we were supporting trans refugees.

But I'm trying to change my attitude, so I called. Joe answered on the second ring. He was warm, receptive. He joked, “If I can get corporate to donate the mattresses, maybe you can pray for me in exchange?”

Playing along, I said, “I'll pray for you even if you don't get us the mattresses. What do you want?”

He turned shy. “Well...every night my family prays for other families—all kinds of families, however they got here. That everyone can live in peace and safety.”

“I'll join you in that prayer.” Corporate didn't donate the mattresses. But Joe and his employees all chipped in and paid for them anyhow.

When we get embittered that we are the only one doing God's work, we might stop and ask ourselves if we have prayed and acted in ways that invite others in to find their place in it.

Prayer:

Holy Farmer, may I sometimes stop the stoop laboring to look around and find fellow field hands, with playfulness not bitterness. Amen.
