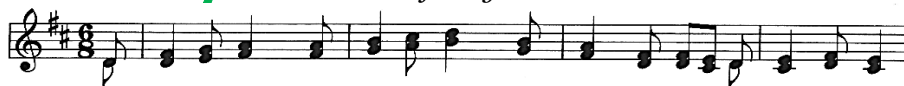

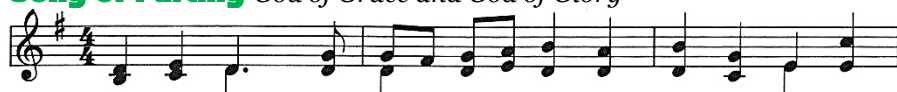

Speaker Series Occasional opportunities after worship at 11:15am **"Bletchley Park; Home of WWII's Codebreakers," by Parks Smith.**

TODAY | 11:15am | Heritage Room

Bletchley Park, in England, was the top-secret home of the World War II "Codebreakers," a term for the over 9,000 men and women who intercepted and cracked German war messages. Winston Churchill referred to the Bletchley staff as "the geese who laid the golden eggs and never cackled." Our speakers, Parks Smith, is a retired St. Louisan historian, who often speaks at the St. Louis History Museum.

Mr. Smith will explore Bletchley Park's history from 1939 to 1946, sharing stories of those who worked there and detailing how German messages were captured and decoded during the Battle of the Atlantic. Eco Stewards January Newsletter Live Lightly For the Planet

We encourage Parkway members and friends to join the Parkway Eco Stewards' FUNDrive, which is collecting clothing and household items. By participating, you will recover space, shoppers will find bargains, and the world will benefit from lower carbon emissions.

It helps the environment to donate used clothing. According to Sachi Mulkey, a climate science journalist, and Rebecca McCarthy, a Grist climate news fellow, fashion is the third most polluting industry after energy and food. The industry generates as much as 10% of all planet warming emissions.

Initially, certain fibers are environmentally taxing. Cotton, grown from seed, requires large amounts of insecticide and water. (Hemp is a more sustainable natural fiber.) Then there are petroleum-based fabrics, like polyester.

Manufacturers of these fabrics pollute with PFAS, (per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances), forever chemicals that don't degrade and have been found in drinking water, farmland and our bodies. Finally, fabric dyeing and processing causes shedding of micro plastics and toxins, such as heavy metals, into our waterways.

Clothing production also creates waste from overproduction. Particularly as stores shift to fast and hyper fast fashion, fashion cycles accelerate, manufacturers overproduce to keep expenses down, stores are encouraged to overorder. The clothing trade generates some 170 billion garments per year, half of which wind up being thrown out within that year. This waste despoils the world's land, air and seas.

What can we do about this? Participate in Parkway's FUNDrive!

We accept the following materials: clothing, household textiles, small household goods, books, and media. Bags and boxes will be accepted until March 7, with funds going towards the Youth Group Mission Trips and Eco-Stewards Pollinator Garden. Drop off bags and boxes in the Fellowship Hall, to your right, when you walk in on Sundays. In the December, the Church Council adopted a motion to the affirmation of certain principles from the General Synod 35 Resolution "Declaration for an End to Genocide in Palestine." *We affirm* that all are made in God's image and are deserving of life free from oppression, persecution, and violence. *We reject* any theology or ideology including Christian Zionism, Supercessionism, antisemitism, anti-Arab, anti-Palestinian, or anti-Islam bias that would privilege or exclude any one nation, race, culture or religion within God's universal economy of grace.

Parkway United Church of Christ is encouraged to receive this Resolution as a prophetic call and commit to: Stand in solidarity with oppressed people, domestic and abroad, and to denounce any atrocities whether that be through the context of public witness, legislative advocacy, legal action, or non-violent direct action; and denounce hate and violence in all its forms including that

rooted in Islamophobia, anti-Palestinian and anti-Arab bias, and antisemitism, as contrary to the teachings of Jesus and the love of God for all humanity.

In an effort to live into this, we'll be offering a five-week reading club of *Rooted in Faith and Justice* over Zoom. The book offers a powerful and enlightening perspective through the eyes of Palestinian Christian leaders and thinkers, helping us to understand the complexities and injustices of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Reminder about Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs)

As the year begins, many retirees will be required to take Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from their Individual Retirement Accounts 2026. You may give up to \$111,000 in 2026 from your IRA to qualified charities, including Parkway, and these Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) have tax advantages. Your gift may satisfy all or part of your RMD, resulting in less taxable income. In addition to reducing taxes, making QCDs may in some situations lower Medicare premiums or even cause less taxation of Social Security.

To make a QCD, the donation must go directly from the custodian of your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to Parkway UCC, as the charitable recipient. That is, you may not make a personal withdrawal from your IRA and then pass that on to Parkway; only contributions made directly from the IRA to Parkway qualify as QCDs. Generally, the procedure for making a QCD is to contact the administrator of your IRA and ask that a gift be made directly from the IRA to Parkway. If you have check-writing features on your IRA, you can write a check on the IRA directly to Parkway.

The funds must be removed from your account and deposited by the recipient by December 31. Parkway will provide you with a written receipt for your gift made through your IRA. You can consider establishing a continuing QCD over a series of years. For example, you might wish to create a QCD of \$3000 in each of five years. This would result in a contribution of \$15000 over the five years with the tax advantages described above.

If you wish to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution, we recommend that you consult with your tax or legal advisor to make sure you have followed the proper procedures, and that the QCD fits with your tax and estate planning objectives.
