Scripture Matthew 4:12-23 | Common English Bible (CEB)

Now when Jesus heard that John was arrested, he went to Galilee. He left Nazareth and settled in Capernaum, which lies alongside the sea in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali. This fulfilled what Isaiah the prophet said:

Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali,

alongside the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles,

the people who lived in the dark have seen a great light,

and a light has come upon those who lived in the region and in shadow of death.

From that time Jesus began to announce, “Change your hearts and lives! Here comes the kingdom of heaven!”

As Jesus walked alongside the Galilee Sea, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew, throwing fishing nets into the sea, because they were fishermen. “Come, follow me,” he said, “and I’ll show you how to fish for people.” Right away, they left their nets and followed him. Continuing on, he saw another set of brothers, James the son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with Zebedee their father repairing their nets. Jesus called them and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him. Jesus traveled throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues. He announced the good news of the kingdom and healed every disease and sickness among the people.

January ONA News

In 2026, this column will include advocacy opportunities, storytelling, and ideas for our congregation to further lean into its Open & Affirming covenant.

First, let's talk about this weekend's opening of "Authentic Selves."

This photo exhibit shared the stories of 16 trans or nonbinary people using outstanding color portraiture and personal testimonies. We welcomed as a guest speaker Jordan Braxton to the opening reception. Jordan has been an activist in the St. Louis LGBTQIA+ community for almost 40 years, raising awareness about HIV/AIDS, intersex and trans rights. In entertainment and fundraising circles, she is known for her illusion of the incomparable Dieta

Pepsi. "Authentic Selves," which will be on view through Feb. 8, not only combats the misinformation about trans people seen in the media, but it also celebrates the courage and joy of these individuals.

Right out of the gate, the Missouri Legislature has begun its attack on trans youth and athletes in the early days of its 2026 session. Of the 44 anti-LGBTQ+ bills that have been filed so far, seven aim to make our laws permanent that ban trans young people from accessing healthcare and playing sports. There also are bills that ban social transitioning in schools and force teachers to out trans students. Please sign up at PROMO Missouri to track these harmful bills and use your voice to testify in person or submit written testimony. There is, however, a spot of good news for LGBTQ+ youth! Amplify the Arch is a conference (Feb 8) by and for queer youth. Held at the Renaissance Airport Hotel, the full day will include workshops, artists, performances, a human library experience, resource booths and more. Volunteers are needed. Consider attending and supporting Amplify the Arch.

In the December, the Church Council adopted a motion to the affirmation of certain principles from the General Synod 35 Resolution "Declaration for an End to Genocide in Palestine." We *affirm* that all are made in God's image and are deserving of life free from oppression, persecution, and violence. We *reject* any theology or ideology including Christian Zionism, Supercessionism, antisemitism, anti-Arab, anti-Palestinian, or anti-Islam bias that would privilege or exclude any one nation, race, culture or religion within God's universal economy of grace.

Parkway UCC is encouraged to receive this Resolution as a prophetic call and in an effort to live into this, we'll be offering a five-week reading club of *Rooted in Faith and Justice* over Zoom. Reminder about Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs)

As the year begins, many retirees will be required to take Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from their Individual Retirement Accounts 2026. You may give up to \$111,000 in 2026 from your IRA to qualified charities, including Parkway, and these Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) have tax advantages. Your gift may satisfy all or part of your RMD, resulting in less taxable income. In addition to reducing taxes, making QCDs may in some situations lower Medicare premiums or even cause less taxation of Social Security.

To make a QCD, the donation must go directly from the custodian of your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to Parkway UCC, as the charitable recipient. That is, you may not make a personal withdrawal from your IRA and then pass that on to Parkway; only contributions made directly from the IRA to Parkway qualify as QCDs. Generally, the procedure for making a QCD is to contact the administrator of your IRA and ask that a gift be made directly from the IRA to Parkway. If you have check-writing features on your IRA, you can write a check on the IRA directly to Parkway.

The funds must be removed from your account and deposited by the recipient by December 31. Parkway will provide you with a written receipt for your gift made through your IRA. You can consider establishing a continuing QCD over a series of years. For example, you might wish to create a QCD of \$3000 in each of five years. This would result in a contribution of \$15000 over the five years with the tax advantages described above.

If you wish to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution, we recommend that you consult with your tax or legal advisor to make sure you have followed the proper procedures, and that the QCD fits with your tax and estate planning objectives.
